According to Mrs. Clancy, Rhame Avenue School in East Rockaway was damaged during the storm and the entire school is now being housed in Centre Avenue School. There are now two classes of students to every one classroom at Centre Avenue. Each classroom holds approximately 40 to 50 students. The students of East Rockaway need school supplies and everyday items.

The first grade students began by brainstorming about the different supplies that the students needed for everyday use, including pencils, paper, crayons, glue, scissors, and notebooks. From there, they started collecting these items and in total, collected 10 boxes of supplies which were donated on Thursday, December 6th to the Centre Avenue School.

WILSON

On Thursday, December 13th, FBI Special Agent Danielle Messineo, RVC Police Commissioner Charles Gennario and RVC Lieutenant Chris Romance spoke to fifth grade students about the positive and negative aspects of Internet usage. The event was presented live at Wilson School and simulcast using our vBrick system for other fifth grade classes throughout the district. The informative presentation covered cyberbullying, predators and privacy setting usage. Students actively participated in a question and answer session, in person and virtually via email questions posed from other schools.

Danielle Messineo has been a Special Agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation since 1995. She is currently assigned to the Long Island Innocent Images Task Force, a combination of local and federal law enforcement partners who work in collaboration to investigate the online sexual exploitation of children. She has been the primary investigator for child pornography matters for nearly a decade and works closely with our police force in protecting our community's children.

Since second grade, students have learned about Internet safety through integrated units conducted in the STELLAR program. The transition into middle school will greatly expand their lives. As they mature, each child will make many personal decisions, including smart use of the Internet. This program represented another building block in honing their Internet Safety skills and keeping them safe.



MIDDLE SCHOOL

On Friday, December 14th South Side Middle School revealed its brand new S.T.E.A.M (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) Lab during a ribbon cutting ceremony. According to Director of the Arts, Dr. Brian Zuar, the S.T.E.A.M Lab was originally a music lab with 12 stations, but with the help of a grant from the Rockville Centre Education Foundation the District was able to add 8 work stations and update the already existing equipment so the room now has the capacity to teach science, technology, art, engineering, and math.

The grant was applied for in March of 2012 by Dr. Zuar and Assistant Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction, Mr. Christopher Pellettieri. "We felt that this was an important project because interdisciplinary work makes students college and career ready and has a strong connection to Common Core Standards," said Zuar when asked why they applied for this grant.

HIGH SCHOOL

Students and staff at South Side High School have come together to raise money for history teacher, Vinnie Falivene's mother, Barbara, who became very ill when her gall bladder burst causing severe life threatening damage to her small intestine. She does not have Health Insurance and her family needs to fundraise so that she can be admitted to Mt. Sinai Hospital.

When the students learned of the plight of their teacher and his mother, they immediately began brainstorming ideas to raise money. At first, a website was set up to accept donations. The information quickly spread around Facebook. In addition an email was sent to each club in the school detailing the situation and asking for support.

Students set up a paper thermometer in the High School lobby that displays the current amount of money raised. So far, a walk-a-thon was hosted which raised \$3,000, and on Wednesday December 19th, 15 teachers volunteered to have their heads shaved for every \$200 donated to the fund. 
