
Title of Book: *The Playbook*




Title of Book: *Solo*




Title of Book: *Rebound*






Title of Book: *Chains*




Title of Book: *The Strange Case of Origami Yoda*


Title of Book: *Crenshaw*

Title of Book: *The One and Only Ivan*






Title of Book: *Souder*




Title of Book: *Mr. Popper's Penguins*




Title of Book: *Crispin*




Title of Book: *Tuck Everlasting*




Title of Book: *The Indian in the Cupboard*




Title of Book: *The Thing About Jellyfish*

“*The Thing About Jellyfish* shows how something ordinary can turn out to be extraordinary.






Title of Book: *The Bad Guys Series*






Title of Book: *Blubber*




Title of Book: *Raft*




Title of Book: *The Name of this Book is Secret*




Title of Book: *If You're Reading This, It's Too Late*




Title of Book: *Unauthorized Harry Potter and the Art of Spying*




Title of Book: *Millions*








Title of Book: *A Dog's Purpose*






Title of Book: *Ellie's Story*
